Qualifications:

Applicants must have a MSW and DSW/PhD from an accredited university, and knowledge of and experience in conducting and teaching social work research. Expertise in the substantive area of School Social Work is desired. Two years post-master's practice experience is preferred. Practice, teaching, and research experience with ethnic populations is highly desirable, particularly those ethnic populations of the Southwest, Latinos/as, African Americans, Asian American, and/or Native Americans. Teaching experience at the graduate level is desired. Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching and other comparable experience.

Responsibilities:

Full-time tenure-track position with the primary responsibility of teaching graduate social work research courses from a transcultural perspective. Candidate must address the needs of a student population of great diversity – in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation – through course materials, teaching strategies and advisement. In addition to teaching, candidates are expected to engage in scholarly and professional activities such as publishing and seeking external funding, participating in curriculum development, and providing service to students and the University. A candidate's scholarly and professional endeavors should support the transcultural mission of the undergraduate and graduate social work programs in the School of Social Work.

Salary Range: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
